


ROOM 202: Dale Achenbach and Steve Coates



Healthy Kids Running Series (HKRS) was created to motivate kids to lead a healthy lifestyle through running. It's an inclusive youth running experience where kindness is taught and every runner is cheered for. Through my son Parker, my family and I have attended this event for several years. It is a very positive and exciting affair. HKRS is a national organization and holds its annual event in York at Springettsbury Parkright in our backyard! The races start with 2-year-olds doing a 50-yard dash and continues up to high school aged kids running a two-mile race. The Spring 2022 series starts April 10th and goes to May 15th, skipping Easter Sunday. The first race starts at 4pm and the last race starts around 5pm.
