



The Yorkshire Finance Committee recently met to review the June 30, 2023 financial statements, as we are at the half-way point of the fiscal year. The financial performance for the first half of the year is filled with accomplishments, challenges, and opportunities. Following are a few of the most significant:

Accomplishments:

The Yorkshire Trustees have done a terrific job identifying maintenance issues, and prioritizing them, all within the constraints of our budget and



Obtained accommodation from the Conference to utilize the old Parsonage escrow previously held at the Conference Seedling Fund, to make a sizeable principle payment on the Fellowship Hall loan balance of \$42,000. That will save us approximately \$3,000 a year in interest expense.

Challenges:

General offering is \$10,237 behind budget, or 5%. More troubling, is that we are \$12,790 behind 2022 giving, or 6%. In other words, some of our giving simply shifted from general offering to the Building Fund.

Designated giving currently trails our 2023 budget by \$6,750 or 32%, but exceeds 2022 by \$7,755 or 124%.

Building Fund contributions (maintenance projects and Fellowship Hall loan) are \$2,030

behind budget, or 15%. However, in comparison to 2022, building Fund

contributions are up \$6,428.

Preschool contributions are \$213 behind budget, or 11%.

Mission contributions are \$4,510 behind budget, or 89%.

Opportunities:

Grow the Joyful Noise Preschool enrollment for the upcoming school year! The preschool will run at a deficit, unless we are able to utilize some of the capacity offered by the current staffing levels.

The Fellowship Hall loan balance has a balloon payment due after 10 years. We can continue to save interest expense and retire that early if we are able to make additional principal payments on the loans. Please continue to support the Building Fund, but do so without detriment to your general offering.

In summary, we are currently managing our expenses and addressing building repairs in the most economical means possible. We are operating as a very lean operation, but are being faced with deferred maintenance and other needs that come with an aging facility. Currently, because our giving is not matching our expense requirements, we are utilizing our fund balance reserves to make up the difference. But those reserves are limited. To minimize the ongoing deficits, we are hopeful that our fellowship will prayerfully consider additional gifts to our general offering. Other ways that we are seeking to improve our overall financial position is through continued growth of the congregation- invite all your friends!




Cod was faithful to provide and show his power through the ways I received support both financially.


Coming in the fall will be two new adult classes!


The first one "From Death to Resurrection" will focus on the knowledge that Jesus came to die in the place of sinners, but He also came to rise again for their salvation.


