On Sunday, **November 12th**, Micah Ruch will be sharing the message in worship and his ministry at West Chester University during both Sunday worship times.



The community's need continues to grow.

In July, over 7,600 meals were served, a new record for meals served in a month. During the month of August, over 9,300 meals were served. In September, over 10,000 meals were served.



LifePath served 75,849 in 2022, in October, the number of meals served exceeded the count from 2022.

Each day numerous individuals come to LifePath for shelter, food and connection to services and through God's faithfulness the need is being met.



Literacy for All

Sunday, October 29th, Henry visited Yorkshire to share the work that he is doing in Africa. Please keep Henry and his ministry in prayer.

Henry shared he prayed for direction, God let him to build a training center with a prayer garden. In the garden is a well, they have enough water for their use and provide water for 30 families. The prayer garden was the first area built (it's about 4 times larger than Yorkshire's Fellowship Hall). Following God's will, starting with prayer, everything else will fall into place. Henry had experience working in construction, God used his talents to build a 5,000 square foot training center. Classes are held everyday, individuals travel up to 200-250 miles to the training center. After completing training, individuals will go back to their hometowns and share the Gospel. "Those who had been scattered preached the word wherever they went." Acts 8:4 NIV



During Sunday School, henry shared a message "The Kingdom of God, The Day of Atonement and the Daniel 7:13-14 Moment".

"The Kingdom of God is a very important subject of the Bible. Jesus began His ministry preaching, "Repent, for the Kingdom of God is near." Jesus also taught that: This Gospel the Kingdom shall be preached to all the world, and then the end shall come.

I asked God what is the Kingdom of God and why did Jesus say... "the Kingdom of god is near?" It took about 50 years of bible reading and study for me to understand this message that I am sharing. I did not learn this from anyone. I truly believe it was taught to me by the Holy Spirit! By looking at these verses we can understand with crystal clear clarity what exactly the Bible refers to when it speaks about the Kingdom of God.



This teaching has been very important to me and my work. If we are to preach "The Gospel of the Kingdom of God" we should have a clear understanding of what exactly the Kingdom of God is.

One lie the "Son of Man" is brought to the Ancients of Days. He is given an eternal Kingdom. Daniel 7:13-14 and Revelation 12:1-11 are the two most important, clearest passages of scripture teaching about the Kingdom of God. In these two passages we find reference to what I call the Daniel 7:13-14 moment.

John 12:23, 31 agrees with Revelation 12 in that the casting out of Satan occurred because of Christ's work on earth.

In Hebrews 9 we have explained in detail when Christ ascended to heaven and entered the holiest place in Heaven with His own blood for us, to purchase, to obtain eternal redemption. I believe this is the Daniel 7:13-14 moment. Here we see that the Day of Atonement is a prophetic picture of the Daniel 7:13-14 moment. The cross has defeated Satan.



Responsibilities:


- Before first service, brew one pot of decaf and one pot of regular. Leave them on burners to stay hot.
