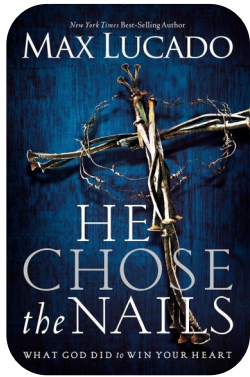

1. Pray for spiritual protection. Pray that they will be protected spiritually, and be able to minister effectively despite spiritual attacks. Psalm 91:9-10
2. Pray for a strong family, including a common commitment to God first, family second, and ministry third. Psalm 27:1; Colossians 3:18-21
3. Pray for a vision of what their ministry should be. Pray for sensitivity to the leading of the Holy Spirit as plans are made and prayed over. Acts 16:9-10
4. Pray for sensitivity to other cultures. Cultural sensitivity is the critical first step in building relationships that will bear fruit for the kingdom. Acts 17:16-23
5. Pray for necessary financial support. Pray that their financial needs will be met in a timely manner, so they can focus on the needs of the ministry. 2 Corinthians 8:1-4
6. Pray for prayer partners that will consistently raise them up to the throne. Colossians 4:2-4
7. Pray for the salvation of those to whom they are ministering. Pray for that fruit and that it will yield a harvest of multiple ripples of salvation. Matthew 13:23
8. Pray for wisdom about how to minister. Ministering in another culture may mean having English classes or sewing lessons, drilling wells, establishing and running medical clinics, or providing for education. 1 Corinthians 9:19-23
9. Pray for wisdom about how open they should be about their faith and work, especially in hostile or closed countries/cultures. Philippians 1:9-10
10. Pray that God-seekers would seek out the missionary. Pray that God would grant courage to those who are genuine seekers. Hebrews 11:6
11. Pray for their prayer life and spiritual growth. Pray that they will prioritize their relationship to God. Hebrews 6:1; 2 Timothy 2:8
12. Pray for physical health. Also, healthcare insurance is often a hardship to obtain, so pray that they would have appropriate and affordable insurance. Proverbs 3:1-8
13. Pray for friendships, both with other missionaries and ministry workers, as well as genuine friendships among the people to whom they are ministering. Ecclesiastes 4:9-12
14. Pray for safety in travel. Travel, both on the field and to and from the States, is frequently required of missionaries. Acts 21:5-6; Romans 15:23-25, 31-32
15. Pray for a positive testimony in the community and with neighbors. Acts 4:13-16
16. Pray that missionaries would develop the gifts God has given to them. Romans 12:3-8
17. Pray for an evangelistic spirit. No matter what aspect of ministry the missionary is engaged in, they need to have that heart for the lost. 1 Corinthians 3:7-11
18. Pray for the sending agency of the missionaries you are lifting to the throne of grace. 1 Timothy 2:1-2; 5:17
19. Pray for the physical space needs of the ministry. Pray that real estate may be available to meet these needs. Proverbs 11:1; Acts 28:20
20. Pray for times of refreshment. Missionaries need regular times away from the ministry to recharge so they can minister effectively. 1 Kings 19

An update from Micah at West Chester University:

“The end of January also marks the beginning of the spring semester, which has been joyful. I have loved being back on campus, to Bible studies starting up again, to meeting up for discipleship again, to pursuing students who do not know Jesus as Lord and Savior. I am once again reminded of what a blessing it is to be able to be on campus and doing this work, and I am grateful for your faithful giving and prayers.

I have been meeting up with a student, Jack, who is not a believer, who I met in the gym over a year ago. We meet up once a week to read the Bible, talk about life, and to answer questions he has about the Bible and about Christianity. It has been encouraging this semester so far that his posture towards the Bible and Christianity seem to be changing. At first, he was incredibly skeptical and even sarcastic in his questions though I know he genuinely has a desire to know what Christianity is about. Our last two meetings, he is far more genuine and asks deeper questions about how the Bible relates to him rather than just if all the animals could truly fit on the ark that Noah built. Please pray for him that he would repent and believe the gospel of Jesus Christ!



We are also studying through the book of James which has been wonderful. Every Tuesday night, around 10 college men gather together to read, study and discuss God's Word and the implications for our life. I am always encouraged by these students who are attempting to follow Christ in a difficult and hostile place like a secular college campus.”

Once again, JNCP and Yorkshire Church will be participating in the Healthy Kids Running Series.

HKRS is a national non-profit that was created to motivate kids to lead a healthy lifestyle through running. It’s an inclusive youth running experience where kindness is taught and every runner is cheered for. Also, if a family cannot afford the cost of the program, there are opportunities to apply for registration assistance.

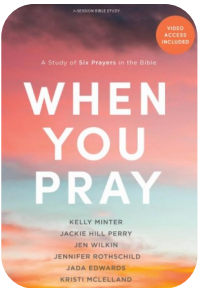

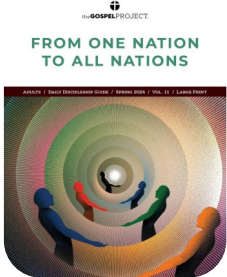
Women’s Bible Study


### Legacy Giving
